Dear Member of AIPPI-US:

As you know, AIPPI is the world's leading non-government organization for research into and formulation of normative policy for the law of various countries relating to the protection of intellectual property. With 9,000 members organized into various national groups, AIPPI unites practitioners, academics and owners of intellectual property.

Work is progressing in several AIPPI-US committees for working questions for the AIPPI-Paris 42<sup>nd</sup> World Congress (Oct. 3-6, 2010) and for organization and planning for the AIPPI-US Annual Meeting and International IP Forum (Chicago, Nov. 7-8, 2010) (to be co-sponsored by the Intellectual Property Law Association of Chicago, i.e., IPLAC). Our Executive Committee has approved an overture to the American Intellectual Property Law Association (AIPLA) to explore possibilities for working together to advance the interests of members of both AIPLA and AIPPI-US. As President, I receive regular requests from the AIPPI Bureau in Zurich seeking input from the U.S. Group on various international IP questions, for example, a recent question concerns the U.S. perspective on proposed mandatory disclosure in patent applications of "the country of origin of genetic resources and traditional knowledge." Invoices for 2010 AIPPI-US dues were distributed in December 2009, and reminders also have been sent.
